

There are 4 assessment objective in the GCSE ART EXAM and they are all worth the same amount of points.

In this power-point we are working on the first 2 :- RESEARCH and EXPERIMENTATION

You may struggle with the **RESEARCH** objective. If you do, just use the research on this power-point and the next power-point, called **Y10 VISUAL AIDS- SKULLS- WK 1.** When we get back to school I will print it all out for you to add to your sketchbook.

If you haven't got **art materials** at home don't worry, you can do some really nice work with a pen and pencil. You don't have to work on really nice paper you could use newspaper, cereal boxes, or any scrap paper, you could even collage paper together and work on that. You never know it might end up being really interesting.

The important thing is to get lots of drawings done.



- 1. To hit the first 2 GCSE assessment objectives.
- To start working on a project which interests you and will ultimately develop into a strong final piece.
- 3. To develop work which feeds into the Nature or Identity Project.

It is not just about producing the final piece it is about hitting the assessment objectives (each assessment objective is worth as many points as the final piece). **Today we are focusing only on the first 2 of the assessment objectives.**

Remember it is the whole creative journey that will be marked not just the final piece!



- Researching a theme
- Experimenting

In this power-point I have focused on skulls. You could also focus on skulls or you could pick a different **natural** theme to fit into your Nature project and enhance your project.

HERE ARE THE OBJECTIVES:-

1. Research a natural theme or a theme tod do with identity online This could be flowers, insects, leaves, animal eyes, shells, animal skulls etc. OR eyes, portraits, letters and numbers, personal objects, etc..

- Collect images of your theme from the internet or magazines
- Research information on how to draw your theme
- Research artists who produce images of your theme then collect information on these artists.

Save information into your school area and Mrs Almond will print it out when we return to school .(Power-point is the best option for images) or if possible print out information and keep it in your book.

2. Experiment

- Practice drawing in different ways and with different materials
- Work on different surfaces with a range of materials
- Try different compositions (layouts) and work in different sizes.
- Draw from magazines or images collected online
- Draw from real life objects if possible (shell, leaves, flowers etc.)



Collect information on your theme that will help you produce some interesting art.

If you struggle with this, use mine on this power-point and the next power-point entitled Y10- Visual Aids- Skulls.



Collect Information / research Normally you could go to the FREE Liverpool museum and take photos of lots of natural objects (shells, fish, birds animals, insects

If you struggle with this, use mine on this power-point.





Try drawing then adding small areas of colour


