

GCSE English Language (AQA)

This GCSE course tests students' reading and writing ability. Students are expected to apply their reading and writing skills to previously unseen texts, both fiction and non-fiction.

Both English Language GCSE exams follow the same format: 4 reading questions in Section A, followed by a writing question in Section B. However, the demands of each question are slightly different.

English Language Paper 1 (50%)

In this exam, you are asked to read an extract from a story (usually 1-1.5 pages long) and then answer four questions. Then, you are asked to write a story or description.

English Language Paper 2 (50%)

In this exam, you are asked to read two non-fiction texts, one which is from the 19th Century and one which is from the modern period (1950-present day). You will then need to answer four reading questions. Finally, you will be asked to write a persuasive text which will be about a similar topic to the texts that you have read.
