
Long Term Plan: Year 9

History takes

into account two key themes of British and world history: democracy and dictatorship and diversity. It is important that pupils are able to see how, historically, diversity has been shaped by those in power.

With this in mind, two important historical topics will be covered, in which these key themes will be recognised and addressed. The study of Life in Germany 1933-1945 and the Holocaust will allow pupils to see how power can be obtained through legal and non-legal ways. It will also introduce pupils to contrasting political and social ideologies that we embrace in Britain. The study of Life in Germany will help pupils understand how a country which holds views that are vastly different to ours can create negative experiences for a range of groups within society.

The study of migrants to Britain will allow us to see how British values can lead to a more cooperative and welcoming society for many different faiths and minority groups. We will see how world events had shaped migration to Britain throughout the 20th century, including a key link with Life in Germany; the Holocaust. This is further developed with more nuanced exploration of the experiences migrant groups faced in a local study of migrants to Liverpool, further emphasising the diversity of Britain in the modern era.
