Attendance

Next week we emphasise the importance of strong attendance with a renewed vigour. Students with consistently high levels of attendance are far more likely to gain the grades and qualifications they need to make the next step in education, such as A Level study.

Without these qualifications however, the doors of opportunity available to students can sadly be closed. The Covid-19 pandemic has not helped. Some students have been less confident in returning to school on a consistent basis. For academic and wellbeing reasons therefore, we want to see our students attend every day and we ask for your support with this.

Please speak to your child about the importance of strong attendance, which would be a figure over 95%. You will receive a text message in the coming days which will inform you of the year to date attendance figure for your child. Even if your child is not feeling at their best, it is important that they are in school and important that appointments are made after school hours.

Please remind them that attendance close to 100% carries with it a 94.8% chance of achieving five good GCSEs graded 9-5. However, as the below table shows, poor attendance can contribute to lost learning, therefore strong attendance is absolutely vital.
