# **Learning Habits**

We have made real progress in introducing the basic learning habits you would expect to see in most schools including the expectation that your child is equipped for school, in the correct uniform, punctual to school and lessons and remains on task throughout their learning. A calmer, more productive and happier school is the result with a recent visitor to the school commenting on the transformation in terms of focus and behaviour. However, we do want to improve behaviour on corridors during transitions between lessons and at break and lunchtime so we have worked with our students to ensure they have clarity on how to calmly and sensibly move from one part of the building to the other. We expect walking not running, talking in quiet partners not shouting and for students to avoid any areas which are out of bounds. Please talk to your child and remind them that from next week corrections will be issued for poor behaviour on corridors or for being out of bounds. We have done assemblies with students regarding this and have practised how we should transition so I believe everyone is capable of doing the right thing and getting it right first time, every time.
