A busy week at Dixons Fazakerley draws to a close with a real focus on the co-curriculum this week in my update to you all. Our co-curriculum are the activities, enrichment and clubs that we seek to offer students beyond the formal curriculum.

World Book Day

On Thursday 2 March, we celebrated World Book Day. There were activities across the day to help students develop a love of reading. During Morning Meeting, after sharing their own passion for reading, the Heads of Year announced the two book-related competitions (which will run until 23rd March). The first competition is for students to write a short story based on the title: "A memorable journey". The second competition is for students to design a book cover. The winning entries of each competition will receive a £20 Waterstones voucher. Following on from Morning Meeting, students had the pleasure of seeing their teachers dress up as popular book characters, ranging from Professor Snape to the entire cast of The Wizard of Oz. During their English lessons, students were exposed to literature from a diverse range of authors. Our pupils enjoyed the opportunity to read for pleasure and share their thoughts on some of the lesser-known literary texts. Hearing our students talk about their love of literature and how they plan to re-read some of their favourite books was perhaps the biggest success of the day. Overall, World Book Day was a thoroughly enjoyable experience for both staff and students, and we look forward to the next big celebration of the literary arts.

Edge Hill University Trip

Year 9 and 10 students had a fabulous day at Edge Hill University this week. Whilst they were there they heard a number of different talks about what a typical university is like. This incuded an understanding of the fantastic opportunities there are to participate in a wide variety of sports and societies and also ways of reducing financial barriers of going to University. They also had a tour of the campus, saw what industry-standard recording studios are like and even had time to study some University level Maths lessons.
